Director's Report

Uniforms

Ms. Jones said that she will come in and talk to the quartermasters to try to help with the situation.

Old Business

Adopting the Student Handbook into BPA bylaws – David Darby asked for a motion to adopt the Band Handbook as the standard for support of the band and the directors into BPA bylaws. Kathy Galvin made the motion and Bill Gorman seconded it; all members present agreed. Motion was passed.

5k fundraiser – David said that the 5K discussion will be put off until January because of conflicts with other races in November. David will investigate the 5K then.

Savannah/Atlanta trip status – Kathy said that the trip info has gone out on email, the web, and a flyer. She made a travel booklet with info for the students. As they check in they will receive

the booklet, cinch bag, beads, and a lanyard wallet. The booklet has rooms, student names, rules, info on the attractions and fun facts.

Next year's trip status – Mr. Malcolm said that any trip next year is on hold for now.

FBA Solo and Ensemble – David complemented everyone for all of their work.

Journey Thru Jazz Concert - Mr. Malcolm said that there was some great music and performers at the concert this year and thanks to everybody.

Funari student visit – there are about 18 families who will be hosting. P.L. said that he will need a line item for some expenses such as a bus to UCF on Monday. Bill moved that money be appropriated for the bus to UCF for the Funari students. All members approved. The Funari students want to experience Florida and American life while they are here.

New Business

BPA Board Nominations – Scott Smith is heading up the nomination committee. He will take nominations and they will be voted on at the showcase concert.

Show Case Concert – David wanted to have someone do publicity for the concert on May 10. Deborah said that she would take the job. He said that anyone who could help with the publicity send their ideas to Deborah. Brochures and posters were discussed for the different events. Wendy asked if it was possible for students to perform at the dinner. Mr. Malcolm said that would be possible and that cafeteria people could be hired to work the food. Mr. Doelle is certified in food service and has the food donated. Kathy discussed the ticket cost and baskets. P.L. suggested that if they pay for the dinner they get a special line to see the concert. \$5 for the concert and \$10 for dinner and show, students would be \$3. A committee will hammer out the details.

Band Banquet – Scott said the date needs to be changed because it is not available at the Westin. The 25 th, which is a Friday, is open if we bring a deposit check. Sallie wrote a check for the deposit. The dinner cost is \$18 as the Westin agreed to keep it the same as we paid last year. Ticket price will be \$15. Photo booth use was discussed. Mr. Malcolm said that we should buy a photo booth and rent it out. Scott thought that the photo booth should not be used at the banquet this year, but the money could be used for a keepsake instead. PL said we should explore the possibilities and what is the best use of the money. Scott said his team has chosen the Grammies as the theme this year. Scott will set up the arrangements with the Westin this week.

Sheryl Parker asked about parade details and parent seating and viewing. Parking was discussed and Marcie said they will be taking a taxi because they are not traveling with the group. Kathy said that the band will be leaving right after the parade and eating on the road.

Scott Smith moved to close the meeting and Bill Gorman seconded it, all agreed.
