Common questions and answers

If I'm in a magnet program will I be able to do this?

Yes, many of our students are in the Health Academy and I.B. programs. Seminole wants you to be successful academically and to be a part of the school's spirit. Our past drum majors have been Health Academy students, IB students, Valedictorians, and Salutatorians. I know people worry about whether they can handle both band and their classes, and the answer is YES. If you stay on top of your assignments it will be no problem.

Do I need to attend band camp to be in the band?

Yes, this is the only time of the year where we can teach the students marching fundamentals. This is also the time we start our half-time show. Once the show is set we do not change the show numbers. All field placements will be assigned at Band Camp.

How much of my time will this take up?

The class enables us to get most of the music learned but not all can be covered, so after school rehearsals are necessary. During marching season, there is band camp and, when school starts, there are after school practices on Tuesday (2:45 - 5:00) and Wednesday (1:45 - 5:00). Football games are Friday nights. During concert season we have four after school rehearsals, a Pre-Festival Concert and Concert MPA.

What if I don't have my own instrument?

The school has a few instruments for students to rent, but on a "first come first serve basis". There is a \$50 rental fee per semester for student use of school instruments. This includes all percussion instruments. If there is no school instrument for you to use, it will be necessary for you to rent or buy an instrument from a music store. Generally, the school instrument selection includes tuba/sousaphone, baritone/euphonium, marching French horn/concert French horn, bassoon, oboe, bass clarinet, Bari sax.

How much will all this cost me?

Band fees at \$250 for returning members and \$350 for new members. Money is due at the band registration night prior to band camp. The money pays for uniform cleanings, clinicians, instructors, equipment, music, awards, some travel expenses, and many, many other expenses generated throughout the year. We don't want anyone to not participate in band because of finances - There is financial assistance available. You will need to speak to a treasurer about assistance.

Wind Ensemble

The *Wind Ensemble* is Seminole High School's top performing concert band. Admittance into this class is based on auditions and demands the highest commitment to a performing ensemble. Private study is strongly encouraged. The *Wind Ensemble* is a class that meets (for credit) each school day and performs at several concerts and festivals each year. After school rehearsals will take place in the Spring for preparation for district and state concert festival. Students will also be required to perform at the Solo and Ensemble Festival in February.

Symphonic Band

The *Symphonic Band* is open to wind and percussion instrumentalists who have achieved a specific level of playing ability. Admittance into this class is based on auditions and demands a high commitment of participation. Private study is highly recommended. The *Symphonic Band* is a class that meets (for credit) every school day and performs several concerts and festivals each year. After school rehearsals will take place in January and February for preparation for district concert festival.

Concert Band

The *Concert Band* (9GC) is a performing ensemble open to all wind and percussion students. The group will perform several concerts during the year and will emphasize the study of basic musicianship skills. The *Concert Band* class meets every school day (for credit). Opportunities for playing in small groups and solos will also be available. After school rehearsals will take place in January and February for preparation for district concert festival.

Percussion Class

The *Percussion Class* is open to students who wish to study percussion instruments in the band department. The class meets every school day for credit. Students will learn basic fundamentals to advance playing skills on a variety of percussion instruments. During the Fall semester all students work on the marching portion of the band. In the Spring semester students will play solos and ensembles. Percussionists are also assigned to bands and will give a Percussion Recital at the end of the year.

Jazz Combos and Big Bands

Jazz classes are dividing in two performing groups, combos and big bands. The Jazz Chiefs Big Band is the top performing jazz class and auditions are required to participate in this group. Selected years the Jazz bands will travel, the next traveling year is 2022-2023. Band Parent Association

The purpose of the Band Parent organization is to support the band directors and students by assisting with transportation, chaperones, and fund raising activities. The purpose of this organization is to provide entertainment for football games, pep rallies, band festivals, parades, and concerts. It is an integral part of the instrumental music education curriculum at Seminole High School. All members are expected to devote TOTAL DEDICATION and MAXIMUM EFFORT and INVOLVEMENT in all aspects of marching, playing, and performance.
